You get full cover for approved chronic medicine on the medicine list (formulary). For medicine not on the medicine list (formulary), we cover you up to a set monthly rand amount called the Chronic Drug Amount (CDA).

About some of the terms we use in this document

There may be some terms we refer to in the document that you may not be familiar with. Here are the meanings of these terms:

Terminology	Description
Chronic Drug Amount (CDA)	The CDA is a set monthly amount we pay up to for a medicine class. This applies to medicine that is not listed on the medicine list (formulary). The Chronic Drug Amount includes VAT and the dispensing fee.
Medicine class	Medicines with similar chemical structures or similar therapeutic effects.

Provera 5mg	Progestogens – Pregnen (4) derivatives	R230
Provera 10mg	Progestogens – Pregnen (4) derivatives	R230
